10 minutes	Buildings and Grounds Report Stained Glass Window - \$5,000 the entire window needs work. It is too weak to just fix the most recent damage. Insurance may cover some amount.
	Richard is reaching out to companies for bids (both local & national) and an assessment of all the windows - we'd have a detailed report to fundraise with. COST: \$10-12K for such an assessment.
	All our windows need work - even the plain ones. All of them are over 100 years old.
	A bid from 15 years ago for stained glass window repairs was just under \$400K.
	Fr. Mauricio asked that we do the window repairs in honor and memory of Robert Knapp. All were in agreement.
