

NETS OVER THE CRÈCHE: GIVE THE GIFT THAT KEEPS ON PROTECTING

A mosquito net over Baby Jesus' bed during Advent this year will remind St. Paul's parishioners of a chance they have to help prevent malaria, the number one infectious killer in the world. Every two minutes, a child in Africa dies of the disease, each year it infects 300-500 million people and kills 1 million of them. Episcopal

Relief and Development has, for the last twelve years, partnered with NetsforLife (<http://www.episcopalrelief.org/what-we-do/our-programs/malaria>) to successfully lower child mortality on that continent. In 2010, a child died of malaria every thirty seconds. While the current rate is one quarter of that, it is still far too high, and continued use of the nets is essential if the ground that has been gained is to be maintained.

Your family's contribution of \$12 will give an African family the protection of a net; thirty nets from our "village" of St. Paul's will protect an entire village. During this holiday season, give two for the price of one! Generous donors to Episcopal Relief and Development have agreed to match your gift. GIVING TREE IN NARTHEX

Sunday November 25, the last Sunday before Advent, the St. Paul's Annual Giving Tree will be in the narthex. This will not be a Christmas tree (it is too early!), but a tree of branches that will hold gift tags for the families that the Children's Hospital Center for the Vulnerable Child (CVC) has matched with St. Paul's.

The CVC serves foster children, homeless families, and families at risk for homelessness. They match St. Paul's with families in need, give us the families' hoped-for gift list, and we put the gift tags on the tree. Please come pick up a tag on the 25th (and be sure to sign the gift list, so we know who has what tag). Then please buy the present, which could be a new toy, or an item of clothing, or a gift card, and bring it back, wrapped, with the tag, to the church on or before Sunday December 9.
